<p><b>Sussex Police Funding 2018-2022</b>  Email dated 13<sup>th</sup> November 2018, from Anna Beams, SSALC</p> <p>Sussex Police have started the biggest intake of new police officers for over a decade. This has been made possible by the increase in police precept of an average £12 for a band D property, and the PCC releasing £17 million from reserves. It means that over the next four years, Sussex will have 200 more police officers on the frontline than it does today.</p> <p>Although residents are pleased to hear that local policing will be strengthened by these 200 extra officers, they are already indicating that they would like even more.
