### Police reassurance to communities following New Zealand attacks

Following the terrorist attacks in New Zealand, Chief Superintendent Neil Honnor, Head of the Surrey and Sussex Police Joint Operations Command, said;

"Today in Sussex and Surrey we are stepping up reassurance patrols around mosques and increasing engagement with communities of all faiths, giving advice on how people and places can protect themselves.

## Speak out about child sex abuse

Monday 18 March is National Child Sexual Exploitation (CSE) Awareness Day, when agencies and Police Forces across the UK unite to highlight the issues around CSE and encourage the public to speak out against abuse.

Now viewed through the lens of a broader understanding of child exploitation, CSE is a crime that can affect any child, anytime, anywhere, regardless of their gender, social or ethnic background. It can be carried out by individuals, street gangs or groups and occurs where an imbalance of power is used to coerce, manipulate or deceive a child or young person into sexual or criminal activity in exchange for something the victim needs or wants.

Katy Bourne, Sussex Police and Crime Commissioner added: "No child should ever be a victim of this kind of abuse and that is why I am supporting the national #HelpingHands campaign alongside Sussex Police.
