

Good afternoon

Thank you for your email. The Parish Council have brought the condition of the pavement in Lime Kiln Road to WSCC attention for many years, however, the condition of the footpath has not been a priority (the same response the Parish Council received to the condition of the footpath along the A281).

The Parish Council have previously looked into erecting a bus shelter outside the Church of the Good Shepherd but the footpath is too narrow and a shelter would provide an obstruction to residents with mobility scooters/push chairs etc.

I have written to a few residents in Golding Lane re their hedgerow encroaching on the public footpath, please could you provide the locations of the hedgerow and I will send a letter to the owners asking for the matter to be dealt with after the nesting season.

I will include the contents of your email on a future agenda, but due to unexpected expenditure over recent years the Parish Councils reserves are well below the recommended 50% of the precept.
