<u>Questions</u>

Enquiry - Please could you advise if the numbers of scheduled urban cuts are going to be reduced to five or remain at seven cuts in 2020/21? If they are going to be reduced do, you have a map of all the areas, which WSCC cut in Mannings Heath and the hamlets in the south of the parish. Please could you also advise the frequency of the verge cuts along the A281 and if there will continue to be two rural cuts?

Answers

<u>Urban</u>

I can confirm our Urban grass is cut 5 times a year the same as we carried out last year.

<u>Rural</u>

Last year we amended our first rural cut to visibility splays only to allow verges to become more established, and help with our pollinators and seeding of wild flowers. Our second 1-metre swathe and visibility cut ensures safety and a final overall verge cut at the end of the season remains unchanged.

<u>Maps</u>

Unfortunately, we cannot provide maps, however I can provide a list of roads and the total area square.

<u>A281</u>

The A281 falls under our rural grass cutting. Please see the above rural frequencies.
